

Jungle GYM NURSERY

WHO CAN STAY AND PLAY?

We offer 2-hour limit per visit, with a maximum of 3 hours per day, per child FREE. Children must be on a family wellness plan to receive free nursery. After the time limit has been reached, nursery rates apply. Client Rate: \$5.00 per hour per child. Community Rate: \$6.00 per hour per child. We do not prorate. Hourly fees also apply for late pickup.

The room is designed for children under 6 years old. Children 6 years old and older are encouraged to participate in our fun, FREE kids' activities. See schedule for details. If they are checked into the nursery, they must adhere to the same check in policies and behavior guidelines as above. Children are not allowed to sit outside the fitness studios waiting for their parents.

CHECK-IN AND CHECK-OUT

1. Child's shoes need to be removed and socks must be worn.
2. Scan access card to check in. The nursery staff will put a label on your child.
3. Hang up your child's belongings (bags, coat, etc.). Do not leave your personal items, we are not responsible for lost or stolen items.

NOT PERMITTED: OUTSIDE TOYS/ELECTRONICS & FOOD

SICK

Sick children are not permitted inside the Jungle Gym Nursery. If a child seems to become ill during their visit the parent will be asked to come pick them up.

CHILD SECURITY

Parents and their children must have a current photo taken before utilizing the Jungle Gym Nursery. Only parents and guardians who are on the account may drop off and pick-up children from the Jungle Gym Nursery.

OUTSIDE WORKOUTS

Parents may not drop off children and leave the premises unless involved in an "outside" workout.

DIAPERS

Please provide your own diapers. If we use a clinic diaper there is a \$3.00 charge applied to your account. It's always a good idea to bring a change of clothes in case your child has a potty accident.

BEHAVIOR

1. Verbal reprimand.
2. Sit in a chair for a period of time (typically 1 minute for every age of the child).
3. A discussion with the parent to work towards better behavior.
4. Conference with the parents (first warning).
5. If the child's behavior continues, we may ask that your child takes a break from the nursery.
